When you educate a child, or a community health worker, the impact grows over time. We are committed to collaborating with local organizations to develop health care programs that are based on needs identified by the communities themselves and that are capacity building and sustainable. One of our projects provides scholarships for indigenous children to attend school. Another supports a health communications program that uses theatre, and other novel strategies, to popularize important health information.
