

It's time to make some changes.

There are some super sex-educators out there. But we need more.

LET'S DO THE MATH. There are about a guarter million students in BC's high schools and close to a half million more in Kindergarten to Grade 8. They are all entitled to the best sexual health education we can give them, but they aren't all getting it. Adolescent

pregnancy rates in BC are only fifth best in the country. And BC youth – some very young - face some alarming risks of sexually transmitted infection from behaviours they don't think are "real sex".

YOU CAN HELP

We know that four in five of you support publicly funded comprehensive sexual health education in school.1 Parents and students reported to us that they would both like to be consulted more often with regard to sexual health education. And over three quarters of adults think youth should have a significant voice in the Sex Ed they receive.2

The history lesson is clear. In the past decade there have been several studies of the state of school sexual health education, with consistent recommendations for change. Our 2004 research, using Canada's Guidelines for Sexual Health Education as a benchmark, assessed the effectiveness of sexual health education in BC Schools. We asked parents, students, health care professionals, teachers and administrators what they thought. The conclusion: we have some homework to do.

LET'S WORK TOGETHER

A number of parents told us they do not know what their kids are getting as sex education at school. One parent said: "I asked the school for a course outline – there was none!" "There is no consistent manner of sex education," a Public Health nurse told us. "It differs from school to school, class to class, teacher to teacher, year to year. Public health is sometimes asked to come in and teach, but we have no idea what has been taught before."

Schools are an important place for sexual health education to take place. And teachers are an important part of the equation. But some tell us they're not comfortable with the knowledge and skills they have to teach sexual health, and that training is scarce.

The Canadian Guidelines state that: "sexuality is a central and positive part of the total well-being of young people." Students need to be given a basic understanding of their bodies. But they also need to be taught the risks, benefits and availability of all options for prevention of pregnancy and protection from sexually transmitted infections (STI).

ADDED VALUE

But it's about more than "plumbing" and prevention. Comprehensive sexual health education also helps students understand the particular characteristics of sexual relationships. It reinforces the importance of matching personal decision-making with personal values, and of understanding the diversity of sexual self-expression in non-judgmental terms. It's also crucial that this education begin early so that it impacts students well before they are *considering* being, let alone actually being, sexually active.

In the context of comprehensive education, abstinence is taught as the only 100% way to prevent pregnancy, but not as the only option for reducing risk. But how is abstinence being defined? Some don't include oral sex in their definition because it is not sexual intercourse. Alarmingly, many teens think they cannot get a sexually transmitted infection from oral sex.

Personal values and knowledge are critically important companions, especially in our intimate relationships. Studies show that youth, from both secular and faith-based backgrounds, make decisions they think are consistent with their values. But anyone can be at risk because of incomplete knowledge. A study by the Religious Institute on Sexual Morality, Justice and Healing in the US found that youth from congregations that provided young people with comprehensive sexual health education, which did include information about contraception and STIs, reported no instances of either infection or pregnancy, as opposed to congregations who taught abstinence as the only option.

So we are asking students "Are you getting enough?" and we're asking parents - and educators - "Is this the best we can do?"


